### Presented by: Dr Aviv Ouanounou

Dr Aviv Ouanounou is an assistant professor of Pharmacology and Preventative Dentistry at the University of Toronto. He has won numerous teaching awards, including "Best Teacher of the Year Award" and the prestigous Bruce Hord Master Teacher Award.



Dr Ouanounou is a Fellow of the International College of Dentists, The American College of Dentists and the Pierre Fouchard Academy as well as the Academy of Pain Management and the American College of Clinical Pharmacology. He has published and authored numerous articles in peer-reviewed journals and also maintains a general practice in Toronto.

### Pharmacology for the Dental Practitioner: An Overview

Clinical pharmacology studies the effects of drugs and their use for preventative, diagnostic and therapeutic purposes. In this lecture Dr Ouanounou will review the various pharmacological agents commonly used in the daily dental practice, including local anaesthetics, its mechanism, onset and duration of action as well as potential complications associated with its use. He will also review the analgesics most commonly used in dentistry namely, acetaminophen, NSAIDs and opioids. Dr Ouanounou will discuss the adverse effects, common drug interactions and recommended dosages. Dr. Ouanounou will also discuss anti-infectives most commonly used as well as the most common herbal medications and their effects on dental treatment as they have been on the rise. This lecture will cover special topics such as geriatrics, pregnancy, kidney failure and liver disease, all situations requiring special caution on part of the clinician when prescribing or administering drugs in the daily dental practice.

- 1. Understand basic concepts of pharmacology namely pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics.
- Understand the mechanism of action of local anaesthetics, the factors that affect their onset and duration of action and the common complication associated with their administration.
- 3. Be informed of the analgesics currently used in dentistry. Understand the various adverse effects and drug interactions relevant to dentistry.
- 4. Understand the rational use of anti-infective agents in dentistry, both in terms of the management of existing orofacial infections and for prophylaxis against the development of bacterial endocarditis or other infection post treatment.

# Presented by: Penny Hatzimanolakis, RDH

Penny Hazimanolakis is a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of British Columbia. She has been an educator since 2020 and has been dedicated and educated at UBC in the graduate periodontics, undergraduate Dental, and Dental Hygiene Degree Programs and has various teaching and research awards. Her main focus is on therapeutic modalities for periodontal diseases, including implants. She has published and co-authored in multiple peer-reviewed journals.



Penny has been an oral healthcare practitioner in periodontics/prosthodontics since 1994. She has served on various boards with current positions on the PDC Committee and BCDHA Anti-Stigmatism Committee. She regularly volunteers in several programs supporting the lower Vancouver Eastside. ### I Came to Fix My Teeth! WTH Happend?

This lecture takes an unusual approach from the patient's perspective. Imagine being a patient in a variety of different scenarios and visiting your dentist or specialist with certain expectations in mind. You have the best-case scenario, where everything you thought would happened...actually happens! And you have the worst-case scenario, where you feel your life is falling apart.

This presentation will show a variety of everyday situations in dental clinics where we contrast favorable with disastrous outcomes. We explore in detail the main factors behind each outcome and the solutions available. We will illustrate cases that span from implants, to orthodontics, to restorative situations, to jaw reconstruction, to gum disease and systemic implications.

The lecture is meant to be entertaining and comfortably followed by all dental colleagues, be it Dental Assistants, Hygienists, Dentists and Administrative Staff.

Dawn Moon has over 25 years' experience working as a dental hygienist. The last 10 years working primarily with adults with developmental disabilities in the community setting.

Her focus has been on creating oral care guidelines for adults with dysphagia and strategies to help people attain dental care. She continues to advocate for better solutions for adults facing challenges accessing dental treatment.



# Providing Dental Care for Adults with Developmental Disabilities

Dental office visits can be a major challenge for someone who has had trauma around medical appointments, has complex medical diagnoses, or sensory integration and processing issues. Often people are seen in the hospital for dental treatment which can cause distress for a person. Creating a relationship with a dental office is an important step in preventing and treating oral disease. Understanding how to adapt dental visits and recommend specific home care strategies is necessary to provide appropriate dental care.

- Understand the challenges of dental visits for people with complex medical needs.
- 2. Review practical strategies for medically and behaviourally complex clients for dental office visits and daily oral care.
- Discover techniques to assist in preparing a person to visit the dental office and the timeline required.

### Presented by: Dr Peter Walford

Dr Peter Walford graduated from McGill in 1975 and has mentored thousands of dentists over a twenty-year teaching career through study clubs, conferences, dental societies across Canada, and online groups. He has been a Live Stage Presenter at the PDC multiple times and published numerous articles in Oral Health Journal.



He practices in BC on a Gulf Island with nearly five decades of observation to see what works and what doesn't in adhesion-based dentistry.

# Winning Procedures in Adhesion; Bombproof Class IIs and Maryland Bridges that Actually Last

Dr Peter Walford debunks the myth that composite restorations have to be short-lived, or that adhesion is only a minor addition to treatment choices for our patients.

This lecture will cover what can be achieved by optimizing the steps in the chain of technique that ties together composite restorations. Best practices in method, best choices in materials, best methods of isolation and other adjuncts are game-changers in patient comfort and longevity. Learn how the restorative team can expand the envelope before crowns become mandatory, and how to make every treatment durable and painless. Special emphasis will be placed on steps that the CDA controls.

The second part of this lecture highlights a small evolution in the Maryland Bridge technique that elevates this modality from frustration to bulletproof. Dr Walford will show cases with a history of 20 years successful function involving over 500 restorations and spans of up to 10 teeth - amazing!!
